Children will be taught the academic standards from the PA Core. Our goals are to have students reading by the end of kindergarten and gain an understanding of mathematical concepts and number sense so they are ready for first grade.

#### Socialization

Kindergarten prepares children for the following school years because they meet new friends and learn how to communicate. We work with children on learning related behaviors to help them adjust to life in school.

#### Play Based Learning

In Kindergarten, children will learn through play based activities that are integrated with the curriculum. They will explore the content areas through different forms of play.

#### Absences

Please call in your child's absence to the attendance line

- ✓ Please follow it up with a signed note either handed in to your child's teacher or scanned in and signed by you ( we do not accept emails)
- ✓ You have 3 days to get your absence note into school otherwise it is unlawful
- Your child is allowed 7 parent note absences. Absences after 7 require verified doctor's notes. Family vacation days need approval from the principal in advance. Family vacations in excess of 5 days will not be approved

# Notes

It is essential that you put information in the form of a note. This gives me a clear understanding of the information you wish to convey. Examples: pick-up changes, family trips, absences, etc. If your child is absent, a note explaining their absence must be sent into school within <u>three</u> days. Please place notes in your child's folder.

\*<u>Please note</u>: We are not always able to check our email or voice messages throughout the school day, therefore a written note to convey important information is best\*

## Buses

A bus tag will be given to your child. Please verify that this information is CORRECT, then please make sure that your child's bus tag is in a Ziploc baggie and pinned to his/her book bag on the outside so that the tag is visible. If your child's transportation plans change, <u>a note is required</u>.

### Píck Up Arrangements

 If you or anyone else will be picking your child up from school, a note must be sent in explaining the arrangement if this is different from how you established it in the beginning of the year.

If you forget, you may call the office and send in a scanned signed note. Please send • it in by noon. •

### Other Transportation Information

- $\checkmark\,$  Drop Off and Pick Up is in the Circle in front of the gym
- ✓ Buses drop off in front of the school
- ✓ When students arrive, they will walk straight down to their classrooms and sit in the hall until 8:30 A.M.
- ✓ Students can enter the classroom at 8:30 A.M. and will be marked late by 8:40 A.M.
- $\checkmark$  The hallways will be supervised by staff members
- ✓ If you are driving your child to school, please try to car pool and arrive in the circle before 8:30 A.M.
- ✓ If your child will be taking the bus, please supervise them at the bus stops. The bus driver will drop off your K student at the stop EVEN if you are not there to pick them up unless you notify the bus driver.

# Lunch

- Your child will eat lunch here at school. If you wish for your child to buy lunch please send money in an envelope marked with your child's name/teacher (Aramark will communicate more information with you).
- There are free and reduced lunch forms available in the office if you are interested.
- We highly recommend sending in a PACKED lunch the first week or two of school as children are learning the new routine.

Please label all lunch boxes, snacks, water bottles, etc.

As part of the school wellness policy, students are <u>not</u> permitted to bring in food for their birthdays. You may send in a different treat if you choose (goodie bags, stickers, pencils, etc.).

# Snack

Your child will need a snack <u>every day</u>. Please send in one small, healthy snack item to school. Snacks should be finger foods such as pretzels, carrot sticks, apple slices, etc. <u>Our</u> <u>classroom is a peanut and tree nut free zone due to</u> <u>allergies</u>. Please be sure your child's snack does not contain either of these items. We have a water fountain, but you may send in a water bottle with your child if you prefer. <u>Milk, Juice and juice boxes are not allowed</u>.

Parents are welcomed to donate an occasional bag of pretzels or goldfish to the class for children who forget their snack.

# Read Aloud

Each month, a sheet will be sent home for you to record the number of books that your child read (or had read to them) during that month. Return the list at the beginning of the next month and students with 15+ books read will receive a prize.

# Star of the Week

Each child will have a chance to be our Star of the Week. On the Friday prior to your child's week as star, a tote bag will come home with a folder, a "Totally Terrific Me" book, a journal, and our Classroom stuffed animal.

Posítíve Behavíor System A colored "ladder" will be displayed in the classroom and each child will receive a clothes pin with their name on it. At the beginning of each day, all students start on **GREEN**, but they have the opportunity to move up the ladder to **BLUE** or **PURPLE** and/or down the ladder to YELLOW or **RED**, depending on their behavior throughout the day. When a child is given a color change down the ladder, the reason is discussed and we work together to make sure that the action doesn't happen again. At the end of each day your child will color in their Behavior Calendar. If they are moved to yellow or red, a code will be written on their calendar indicating why he/she reached this level. Please keep this calendar in the back of your child's folder and initial it each night.
