Spring 2021

- Research Colleges

- Apply to your selected colleges
- Retake SAT/ACT exams

What makes up an application

- The application
 - This is what you do online
- SAT/ACT Scores
 - You send these in on either College Board or ACT's website
- Your transcript
 - I will send this in for you. Directions to come in the fall
- Counselor/Teacher Recommendations
 - These will also be requested by you, with directions in the fall

When should I apply

- The application
 - You can start this as soon as the college has changed over to the next school year.
- SAT/ACT Scores
 - You can send these in at any time.
- Your transcript
 - Transcripts will not be available until Mid-September 2021 at the earliest.
- Counselor/Teacher Recommendations
 - Talk to teachers before summer break. They will be available next fall.

Common App

The Common App is a generic college application that over 800 colleges subscribe to. If you fill it out, you can re-use most of the information over and over again.

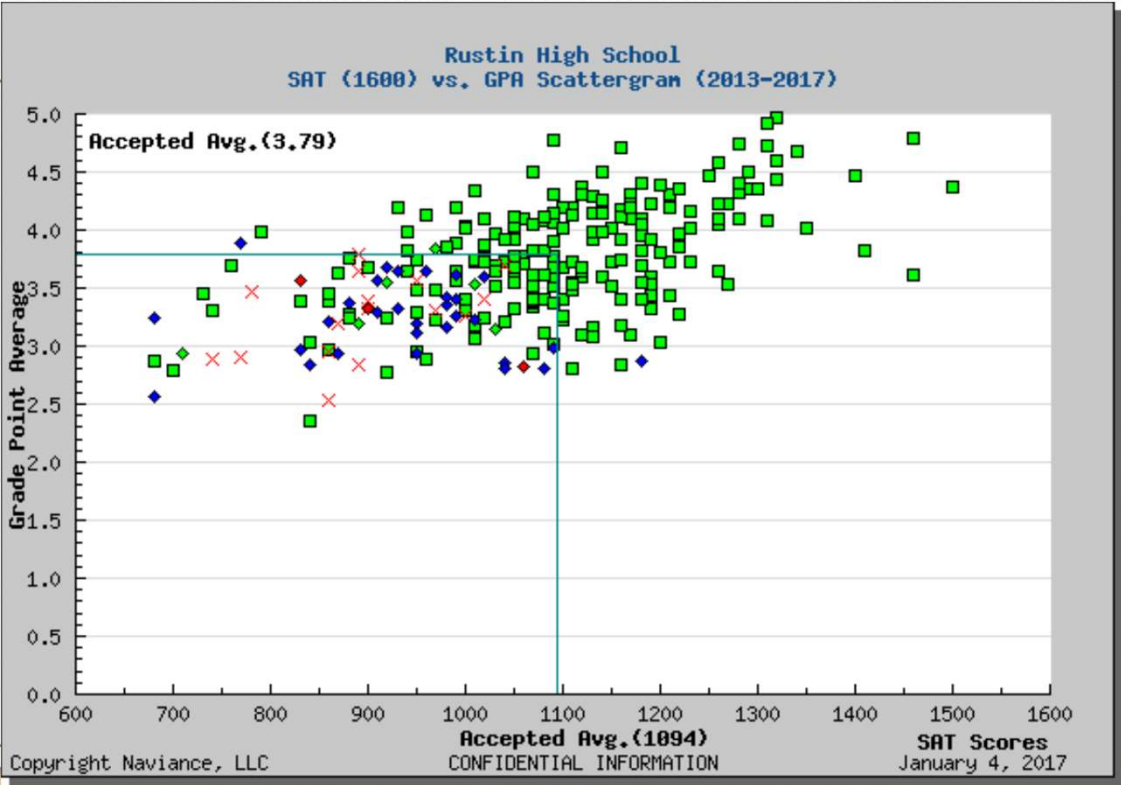
Must Have

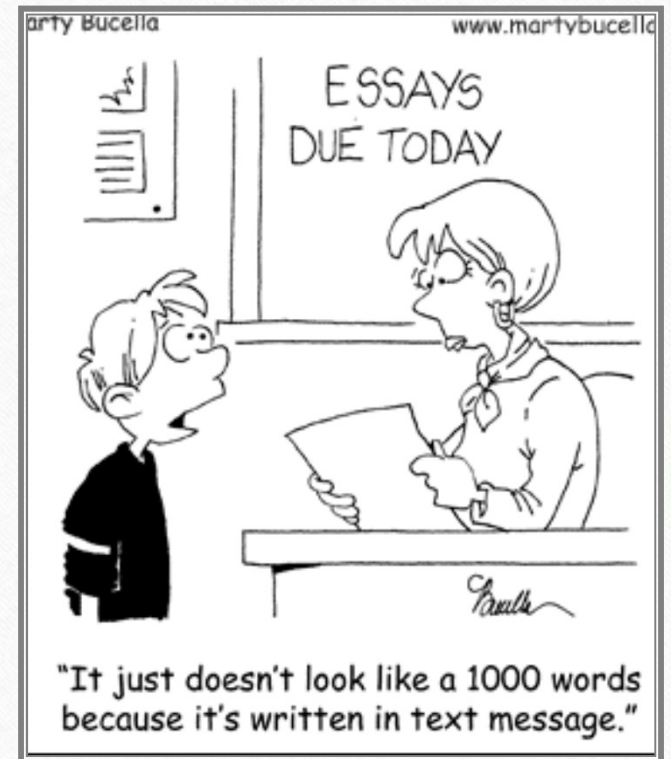
What do colleges look for?

Expertise in a Field/Creativity (*what are you passionate about?*)

Resilience/Obstacles Overcome (*how well do you handle adversity/challenges?*)



Job Shadowing

Job shadowing is a career education experience that brings high school students into the workplace to observe and explore the “world of work” first hand, making the critical link between the 21st century skills they are learning in school and the importance of this knowledge and skill acquisition to future career success.
