- ✓ Register for SAT and/or ACT Plan on two junior year for college admissions
- ✓ Check Individual schools for SAT subjects tests (SAT II) requirements
- ✓ Junior conference: your counselor will schedule a conference with students (3rd marking period)
- ✓ Make list of colleges which interest you. Check websites for majors and other important information
- ✓ Attend college fairs. Be prepared with questions specific to schools in attendance

JUNIOR TIMELINE

- Visit Colleges over spring break and in the summer
- Sports Division 1 or 2 sports, access the NCAA Eligibility Center
 (www.eligibilitycenter.org)
- Extra-Curricular Activities colleges look for consistency and depth in activities
- Community Service/ Volunteer Work pay it forward and don't forget to track service
- Career Exploration hone skills and make connections through career experiences including guest speakers, job shadows, and internships

SAT'VS. ACT

The New SAT: one reading section and one writing section; sections will always be in the same order. The test will be 3 hours, plus the optional essay.

The exact breakdown, in order, looks like this:

Reading: 52 questions, 65 minutes

Writing and Language: 44 questions, 35 minutes

Math: no calculator—20 questions, 25 min; with calculator—38 questions, 55 min

Optional essay: 1 prompt, 50 min

The basic ACT structure and timing is remaining the same, with the exception of the

new essay, which will be longer.

English: 75 questions, 45 min

Math: 60 questions, 60 min

Reading: 40 questions, 35 min

Science: 40 questions, 35 min

Optional writing: 1 prompt, 40 min


- -Students may access the SuperMatch under the "colleges" tab in order to find schools that match up to 23 different search criteria

- -Save colleges that fit your students' need or pin your favorites so that they show on the top of the page while they search


Naviance also provides school counselors the ability to


- ✓ track progress of individual students

- ✓ create reports, send transcripts and collect data for the student population.


Scattergrams will offer useful data tracking for which students get into certain colleges based on GPA & SAT/ACT scores.











Career Search Tools 💸

- Importance of *career* goals for discovering the best *college* fit
- "Working backwards" means knowing what career interests they have help students locate the best college/trade school/training for job placement in that field
- Career exploration includes understanding your personality type, and how it fits with your career choices. Naviance offers personality and career inventories students may access
- Naviance uses 16 career clusters based on information gathered from the Department of Labor and Statistics





Find Clusters and Pathways

Career clusters are a way of grouping careers with common features and skills. Careers grouped into the same cluster typically require similar education and training. Exploring clusters can be a useful way to find a good career match, especially if you have general areas of interest but are not sure what specific careers match those interests. Career clusters can also help you better understand how your coursework in school can prepare you for certain types of careers
