Dear Henderson Parents and Students,

I have always been extremely proud to be a part of the Henderson Community. It is a community that strives to be inclusive and embrace diversity, while remaining connected to our traditions. Perhaps one of the proudest traditions is our mascot, the Warrior. Over the summer, our administration took an in-depth look at this tradition. We wanted to learn more about the history of the Henderson Warrior, its association with Native American Indian Iconography, and how it is perceived through the lens of inclusiveness and diversity.

We had several conversations with students, staff members, community members, and alumni. We connected with faculty at West Chester University and the Chester County Historical Center. And, perhaps most importantly, we spoke with Native American Indians.

Interestingly enough, our research did not show how the Warrior became affiliated with Native American imagery. Through our research, we concluded that students, staff, community members, and alumni favor keeping the Warrior name while removing Native American imagery.

Using iconography that marginalizes a race of people is not a practice that we should continue. It has never been our community's intention to deliberately offend anyone. We plan to work with the student body to create new imagery that is not offensive to Native Americans or any other race or religion. COURSE SELECTION AND SCHEDULE CHANGES FOR STUDENTS 2020-2021

The procedure for establishing class size, schedules and staffing of teachers as well as ensuring a positive educational environment began in February with the course selection process. Teachers, administrators, counselors, students and parents collaborated on students' course selections through the Spring Semester. Schedules are now finalized and changes from one course to another will not be considered. Students may, within the same class period:

- 1. Add a first semester course to an existing study hall or lunch by Monday, September 21, 2020.
- 2. Add a full year course to an existing study hall or lunch by Monday, September 21, 2020.
- 3. Add a second semester course by **Monday**, **February 8**, **2021**.

Level changes for math, English, science and social studies (when appropriate) will be addressed and considered on an as needed basis throughout the school year. Level changes will allowed during the following time frames:

1st Semester

Monday, September 21, 2020 - Friday, January 22, 2021

- * Friday, October 2, 2020 is the final deadline for level changes in English 12 Honors and English 12 Academic Literature
- *Any year-long course that is dropped within the final two weeks of the 2nd marking period, Friday, January 8, 2021 and thereafter for the remainder of the school year will have the course grade recorded as a WP Withdraw Pass or a WF Withdraw Fail. The WP or WF will be based upon the cumulative average for the year at the time of the drop. **The dropped course and appropriate designation of WF or WP will appear on the transcript.**

2nd Semester

Tuesday, January 26, 2021 to Friday, February 12, 2021

There will be no level changes after Friday, February 12, 2021 for the duration of the school year.

A Schedule Change Form must be completed with the appropriate signatures required and turned into the Counseling Office within the time frames listed above or they will not be considered.

INTERIM REPORTS

There are two types of progress reports to keep parents informed of the level of their student's academic achievement. Telephone progress reports are used when a problem needs immediate attention. Written progress reports are used in the middle of each marking period if a student is achieving outstanding work, is in danger of failing, or is negligent in some aspect of work.

Students who are in danger of failing will be given written progress reports to take home. Parents are asked to read the report, sign and return to the teacher. If there are any questions or concerns, parents are encouraged to email the teacher. Interim reports are not disciplinary reports, but are a means of notifying a student's progress mid-marking period.

An interim report must be used whenever a student is in danger of failing a course (cumulative E, or F) or displays negligence in some other aspect of his school work; as per Board policy. Teachers are encouraged to use the positive interim reports as a commendation of the student's work. If there are any questions about student progress, please do not hesitate to contact the teacher and/or counselor.



Henderson High School Attendance Procedures

Reporting Absences

If you are reporting your student absent please email Stephanie Price at sprice@wcasd.net Provide the student's name, date, and reason for the absence. A signed parent or doctor excuse note must be returned within 5 days of the student returning to school. Faxed or emailed parent notes must include a parent signature for it to be an official excuse note. These notes can be scanned or attached as a picture or pdf. If an excuse note is not received within the 5 days of returning they will be marked as unexcused or unlawful. If you have further questions or concerns with your student's absence please call (484)266-3000 extension 3318.

*** During these virtual times, all absences and early dismissal notes will be done electronically through email. It is important for parents to make the school aware of any type of absence no matter if they are doing cyber or 2.0 learning. If your student needs to leave early from a class please send in an early dismissal note in the morning so that we can make teachers aware that your student will be leaving early during their virtual class.

Early Dismissal

When a student needs to leave early from school a written note with a parent's signature is required. The note should include the student's name, date, requested dismissal time, reason for dismissal, if they are returning, and a signature of a parent. This note can be brought down to the Attendance Office or emailed the morning of the dismissal. These notes can be scanned or attached as a picture or pdf. The student will then be given a pass to leave the building at the designated time. If it is a last minute dismissal please call (484) 266-3000 extension 3318.

Late to School

There are five excused reasons for being late to school:

Doctor Dentist Court Appearance Driver's Exam Funeral

Any and all other reasons given for being late to school are not excused. Students who arrive late to school without one of the above listed reasons given in writing by one of the five providers will be considered tardy. Students who accumulate four or fewer lates will not be penalized. Students who acquire five thru eight tardies will receive a detention for each tardy numbered five thru eight. Students who reach nine or more tardies will receive Saturday School for each tardy from nine upward. Tardies are accumulated per semester.

Family Vacation

The family vacation form is found on the HHS website and must be signed by each of the student's teachers and turned into the Attendance Office a week before the trip for Administrator approval. There is a maximum of 5 days per year.

College Visit

The college visit form is found on the HHS website. Proof of a college visit needs to be turned into the Attendance Office along with the form. Accepted forms of proof are: an email from the college that states the date of the tour, a dated parking pass from the college from the day of the visit, or a letter from the College Admission Office received on the day of the student visit. If travel days are needed for a visit, please send in a parent note with the travel dates noted.

Absences are recognized as Cumulative or Non-Cumulative

Students are allowed 20 cumulative absences per year/ 10 cumulative absences in a one semester course.



Academic Integrity Policy

The educational philosophy of Henderson High School includes the concern for the intellectual and ethical development of each student. The goals of the staff and administration are to teach each student to assume personal responsibility for learning and to develop behaviors and attitudes conducive to responsible citizenship. Responsible citizens must accept the ethical responsibility and the consequences of plagiarism and cheating. The administration and staff of Henderson High School do not condone, tolerate, or accept cheating and plagiarism; therefore, the following policy has been adopted by the instructional leadership team of Henderson comprised of parents, teachers, and administrators.

- Any student who copies another student's assignment or part of an assignment or copies from another student during a test or quiz or uses a "cheat sheet" during a test or quiz will receive a grade of zero ("0") on the assignment, test or quiz.
- The student who provides the assignment or permits a student to cheat will also receive a zero (0") on the assignment, test or quiz.
- Any student who plagiarizes defined as intentionally or unintentionally stealing and using the idea, structure, language, context, or writings of another as one's own without crediting the original author through parenthetical documentation, footnotes, or bibliography will receive a grade of zero ("0") on the manuscript.
- Any student who submits a plagiarized manuscript (which was not submitted for a grade) to a contest or for publication will be subject to disciplinary action by the teacher/advisor and the administration.
- If a child is caught cheating or plagiarizing, the teacher has a professional obligation to contact the parents by phone or in a conference.
