Benefits to the Students

Students who earn scores of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research and on four additional AP Exams of their choosing receive the AP Capstone Diploma[™]. This signifies their outstanding academic achievement and attainment of college-level academic and research skills.

Students who earn scores of 3 or higher in both AP Seminar and AP Research but not on four additional AP Exams receive the AP Seminar and Research Certificate[™].



Year 1 Assessment (Seminar)

3 Parts:

- Performance Task 1: Team Project & Presentation (20%)
 - Individual Research Report
 - Multimedia Presentation & Defense
- Performance Task 2: Individual Research-Based Essay & Presentation (35%)
 - Individual Written Argument (70%)
 - Individual Multimedia Presentation (20%)
 - Oral Defense (10%)
- Task 3: End of Course Exam (45%)
 - 3 Short Answer + 1 Essay (2015 Released Exam)



Transitioning from Seminar to Research

After completing the Seminar exam (May, Year 1), students should...

- Develop a list of topics they are interested in researching and begin to form a research question
- Identify expert advisors (STEM / Humanities)
- Possibly begin summer research and develop a plan on working with the advisor during summer vacation
 EX: Summer Internship at CCHS

Year 2 Assessment (Research)

- Individual Academic Paper (75%)
 - 4,000 5,000 words
 - Scored by the College Board
- Presentation and Oral Defense (25%)
 - 15-20 minutes
 - Three person panel
 - Teacher scored
