Each year, WCASD students have the exciting experience of selecting their courses for the following school year!

This process involves teacher recommendations, parental suggestions, counselor advice and student choice. These important decisions serve to guide students during their time with the district. To build an accurate schedule for all students, course changes for both the WC Cyber Program and in-person instruction must be made by March 25.

These suggestions refer only to the minimum requirement of 6.4 credits including Physical Education. There are eight (8) periods in the school day. Level Recommendation Guidelines

There are four different course levels offered at WCASD, including Advanced Placement, Accelerated Honors, Honors and Career & College Prep. Each level is intended to develop students' skills and prepare students for their future endeavors. All level changes for full year courses must be completed no later than three weeks after the end of the first semester. All level changes for semester courses must be completed no later than three weeks before the end of the first marking period.



WC Cyber Program and Blended Learning

High school students have the option of taking classes through the WC Cyber Program. Courses available through Cyber will be designated with the WC Cyber Program logo (()) throughout the course guide. Additionally, WCASD's blended learning courses offer a dynamic learning format that allows students to experience courses where they interact with the curriculum partially at school and partially through online delivery of content and instruction.



Career Education Program

WCASD's Career Education Program connects high school students with real world experiences, serving as a critical link between classroom learning and the world of work. Students in 11th grade have the opportunity to develop skills for success through the Future Readiness elective and community-based experiences, and participate in a variety of curriculum-related field trips, events, and showcases. Additional opportunities for juniors include job shadows and internships, where students will gain exposure to careers by working with business/community volunteers during the work day.



Dual Enrollment Program

The West Chester Area School District dual enrollment program offers juniors the opportunity to concurrently enroll in a college level course that would be considered a high school elective credit. Upon successful completion, students participating in dual enrollment coursework would receive high school advanced placement credit, as well as college credit.

Promotion Requirements (Minimum)

A student who has completed at least 17 credits in grades 9, 10 and 11 will be promoted to grade 12.
