

Mary Poppins A "Practically Perfect" Performance Review

What Was The Play About?

This year Stetson Middle School performed "Mary Popins," which follows the life of a family in London. The family itself is falling apart with an uptight Father (George Banks), a preoccupied mother (Winifred Banks), and two mischievous children (Jane & Michael

Banks). When the children's nanny quits a new nanny named Mary Popins arrives to care for the children and take them on fun adventures while teaching them lessons.

Auditions

The week prior to the audition, myself and **LOTS** of others were scared\nervous, which is completely normal. However there was really nothing to worry about.

The audition itself was very simple: you went into a room with Ms. Bond and Ms. Barrett with a couple others, and one by one sang one of the pre-chosen songs. Learning Chronography and Songs.

While the performance you actually see on stage might seem easy, many hours are put into the rehearsing, day and night. Everything you saw on the stage had been planned for months dating back to the beginning of the year.

My Experience

In this year's play, I was cast as a "Sweep" A.K.A an ensemble (background) character. This means I had no lines, but I was in almost all the dances and songs, with a few costume changes. Speaking of costumes most students in the play had to provide their own costumes. Mine consisted of a black shirt, hat, and pants with a red scarf for when I was supposed to be a chimney sweeper. Rustin High School Theater Program provided some colonial-like costumes that we used for "Parkstroller" or "Townsfolk" dancers.

Acting

This year was my first <u>ever</u> play. Because of this I had a lot I learned and now I have a lot to share. The first time I really acted (in costume.) was when the second graders from Starkweather Elementary School came

to see a snippet of the performance. On the actual performance nights everything went smoothly. The only part of the play cast members and I struggled with was in the beginning when the spotlight was shining in our eyes, but we had to keep a straight face.

Tips for Actors.

- Try breathing in through your nose, holding your breath, and breathing out through your mouth.
- A tip I learned this year was to slowly count down from 5, by shaking your body. EX: Shake arms 5 times, Legs 5 times, arms 4 times, legs 4 times, etc.



Wouldn't it be fun to travel across the world? Who wouldn't want to globe-trot across the Andes or sightsee in France? With so many options, it can get overwhelming when you look at the bucket list opportunities. Where to go? Why not try Japan?

For such an interesting and historically prominent country, not a lot of Americans know that much about it. But Japan makes a good place to visit because, well, there's really something for everyone! From mountain peaks and thick forests to cities so densely packed that the areas appear gray from outer space! There's even a fake Eiffel Tower, but we'll get to that later. For now, here's a list of the top five places to visit in Japan!

Number five:

The Kumano Kodo

Nature lovers, this one's for you. Though really, it doesn't take personal preference to say that the Kumano Kodo is a breathtaking hiking trail. The sunlight through the mountainous trees is refreshing, and the roaring waterfalls look like something pulled from a movie! And each year, the colors in the trees change. In the summer, expect a cacophony of greens, autumn brings a splash of orange, and, in late spring, a blush of pink blossoms will take to the treetops and wind. If you're up for a challenge that promises exercise, take the entire four day pilgrimage trail. The hiking trail has been used as a pilgrimage trail to Kumano for centuries. The walk was itself part of multiple religious rites of purification, and it's great for soaking up the culture of Kumano!

Number four:

Ryogoku: Sumo Central!

Imagine a town almost entirely dedicated to football, or soccer, or lacrosse. You'll find the Japanese version of that in Ryogoku, the sumo center of the globe! Here, expect to see sumo themed restaurants, shops, sumo stables (where wrestlers train), and the sumo stadium to end all others! The current stadium used is called the Kokugikan and is the fourth one built in Tokyo. It hosts three of six annual tournaments that can host up to 10,000 fans. If you've never seen sumo wrestling, it's a rip roaring time that, while might seem hilarious, is actually taken very seriously in Japan! While there, you can also visit lots of museums or Yokoamicho park, which acts as a memorial for both the bombings of World War two and the Great Kanto Earthquake of 1923. And don't forget to try Chanko Nabe; the official food of sumo wrestling, and served at a restaurant with a sumo ring! (Dohyo)

Number three:

Sumida Park

Best if visited in early April, because this park in Asakusa is one of the most popular places for hanami, or cherry blossom viewing! Hanami is very popular in Japan, and the trees have come to represent the fleeting joys of life. When the blushing blossoms appear in starburst pinks and whites, many people, including lots of tourists, have picnics and parties with family and friends. This park is extra picturesque because it sits beside a river



with a city and the Tokyo Skytree in the background (More on the SkyTree later) There are plenty of places to eat and lots of photo opportunities with garden sculptures, especially if you take the boat tour. And at night, the trees are even lit up for a moonlit walk. If flowers aren't your thing, try the summer fireworks instead.

Number two:

Akihabara

Akihabara has won the title of the world's otaku, anime, manga, and video game center, and they really aren't afraid to flaunt it! Up and down the street you'll find people dressed as characters, manga shops, and more. It's also a place to find the latest and greatest in technology. In Akihabara, you can visit maid cafes, where your waitresses dress as characters or maids and serve your food acting as such. I don't understand the appeal, but to each their own, I guess. Then there's manga cafes (manga kissa) that provide free internet for all the nerds out there who want to read comics and watch videos together. Regardless of wherever you go in Japan, though, pop culture will always follow. Better embrace it.

Number one:

The Tokyo tower | SkyTree

Okay, technically these are two places, but who cares?

In addition to representing Japan's post-war rise to power, the 333 meter tall red-and-white Tokyo Tower also serves as a broadcast station. Supposedly, it's supposed to be based off the Eiffel Tower, but let's be honest, they just copy-pasted the Eiffel Tower and painted it. On the lower "Red Tokyo Tower" level are a bunch of interactive games and e-sports, like a super-cool arcade! The "Main Deck" has some lookdown windows, a cafe, and a gift shop. And all the way at the top at the "Top Deck" is a sweeping view of Tokyo that gets some cool sights. Meanwhile, the Tokyo SkyTree is a much, much, <u>MUCH</u> taller tower that will give you a city view like no other. Off-Season Birds' Background Learn the Eagles' early history

The Philadelphia Eagles are one of the best teams in the NFL. Yet, how did they begin? Were they always good, even with star players like Jalen Hurts, Devonta Smith, and A.J Brown. Did they ever go to the Super Bowl before 2017? This article can answer those questions. Join me as we dive into the early history of the Philadelphia Eagles.

Origin:

The Philadelphia Eagles football team began in 1933, when **Bert Bell** and **Lud Wray** purchased the former Frankford Yellow Jackets for \$2,500. In 1941, a swap took place between Philadelphia and Pittsburgh that made a trade with home cities. **Alexis Thompson** got the Eagles while **Bert** and **Lud** obtained the Pittsburgh Steelers.

The Steagles:

In 1943, two years after the big swap, the two cities's football teams were combined. After many players went to help battle in World War II, there was a huge shortage for both Pittsburgh and Philadelphia. The two teams agreed to merge together temporarily for one season. Together, they were called the Steagles. Since there could be no head coach during the merge, head coach **Greasy Neale** of the Eagles and head coach **Walt Kiesling** of the Steelers, agreed to be co-coaches. The team ultimately finished with five wins, four losses, and one tie.

Domination:

Counting the 1943 co-coach season, **Greasy Neale** coached the Eagles for 10 seasons and he led them to their first significant games in the NFL. The Eagles dominated the league for six seasons. They finished second in the NFL Eastern division in 1944, 1945 and 1946, won the division title in 1947 and then scored successive shutout victories in the 1948 and 1949 championship games.

The Fall:

Nearly 10 years later, the Philadelphia Eagles era of domination ended. By 1958, the Eagles had fallen to last place in their division. In just 10 years, the Eagles who were a superstar team fell from one of the best teams to one of the worst. That year, however, saw the start of a rebuilding program by a new coach, Buck Shaw. The team also had the addition of quarterback Norm Van Brocklin in a trade with the Los Angeles Rams!

Recovery:

In just three years, **Shaw** gave Philadelphia another championship. They defeated the Green Bay Packers 17-13 for the NFL championship. **Chuck Bednarik** saved the day for the Eagles with an open field tackle of Green Bay's head coach: **Jim Taylor** on the game's final play. The Eagles didn't reach the playoffs again for 18 years until 1978, their third season under



The Rise:

In 1980, Philadelphia won a club-record 12 games, edged out Dallas for the Eastern division title and then defeated the Cowboys 20-7 for the NFC championship. However, the Eagles lost to the Oakland Raiders 27-10 in Super Bowl XV. In 1988 the Eagles won the NFL Eastern division championship. Starting with that season, Philadelphia, which was particularly dominating on defense, won 10 games for five straight years up to 1993. In four of those years, the Eagles entered the playoffs as a wild-card team, a feat they repeated in 1995.

Coach Legend:

In 1999, Andy Reid was named the team's head coach. He instantly transformed the Eagles into one of the dominant teams in the NFL. Beginning in 2000, Philadelphia won their division six times, appeared in the postseason nine times, and made a trip to Super Bowl XXXIX. Reid served as the team's head coach for 14 seasons, the longest of any coach in franchise history.

Superbowl:

In 1981, the Oakland Raiders destroyed the Eagles 27-10. In 2005, the New England Patriots beat the Eagles 24-21. They never gave up. Twelve years later the rematch occurred. The Patriots were once again competing against the Eagles! This time however, the Eagles won 41-33. Then last year, after a close breathtaking Superbowl, the Eagles did not come out on top losing to the Kansas City Chiefs 25-28.

Players:

There were so many amazing players that played for the Philadelphia Eagles, but the best five players are none other than Jason Kelce, Randall Cunnigham, Brian Dawkins, Donovan McNabb, and Chuck Bednarik. These five brought so much talent and skill to the Philadelphia Eagles. They set the path to a current amazing Eagles team.
