I've gone to Arasapha Farms in Glen Mills twice this season, and the lines have been reasonable, and I've really enjoyed myself. Both times, I've gone with friends, and I would highly recommend that. All of the scariest parts seem much less scary with a friend to face them with you. I'm going to

talk about those times, and recommend some things so that you get the best experience! Don't worry- I'll make sure not to spoil any spooky surprises!

On my first visit, I rode the Haunted Hayride, did the Field Of Screams, and went through the Bates Motel itself. First, we rode the hayride. It was my first time on it, and I loved it! You get to witness all of the scares while feeling like the actors can't *really* get to you, and it has the coolest effects of the three by far. Plus, being scared from behind, or having an actor jump on the side of the cart is so spooky and startling! The only thing is that the hay was a bit wet because it had just finished raining. Fair warning- the hay will stick to your pants! I do think that this is the most detailed and interesting visually, but the one that scares you the

least.

Next up was the Field Of Screams, and that was so much fun! One of my friends clung onto my arm the whole way through, and I won't spoil it for anybody, but there were some really good jump scares! The actors are so professional, and the outfits/makeup are always on point. The structures you walk through are so well designed, and they contribute to the scare. I would advise wearing old shoes if it's at all wet out because the trail does get



pretty muddy. Also, choose where you want to stand carefully. Depending on your place in your group, some actors can pop up!

Lastly, we went to the Bates Motel, which is my favorite. It was very creepy, but it was even



more fun! I think that one is the scariest, because it's in an enclosed space, and you can't run away. It also makes for great jumpscares and some very cool rooms. The one note that I have is that if you dislike enclosed spaces, the Motel may not be for you. Also, there are some fog effects, so you should know that going in. If I had to pick the creepiest of the three, I would say that it would be the Motel. That's because it feels less like you can get away, and the actors are a lot closer.

I would absolutely recommend going to Arasapha Farms. Some tips I would give would be to wear older shoes and to get there earlier in the night. All of the attractions are great at any

time, but if you want the Arasapha Farms nighttime experience, go through the Motel first to avoid some of the worst of the lines. Also, if you're scared about going, recruit some friends for moral support! Plus, the first time you go is always the scariest, because the anticipation is usually worse than the scares themselves. If someone who hates all things horror (myself) can overcome their fear and want to go back to Bates Motel year after year, then you can too! Happy hayriding!


Overall we received over 240 votes!

The major reason why people rewatch it is because the film director and writer Henry Selick said that every small detail was done with intent. Not one thing was just random. So many fans have searched and found many hidden details, and this article has compiled a bundle of these hidden details.



- ★ Once Coraline has entered the Other World, she enjoys a meal with her Other Mother and Other Father. There she receives a cake with the words "Welcome Home" on it.
